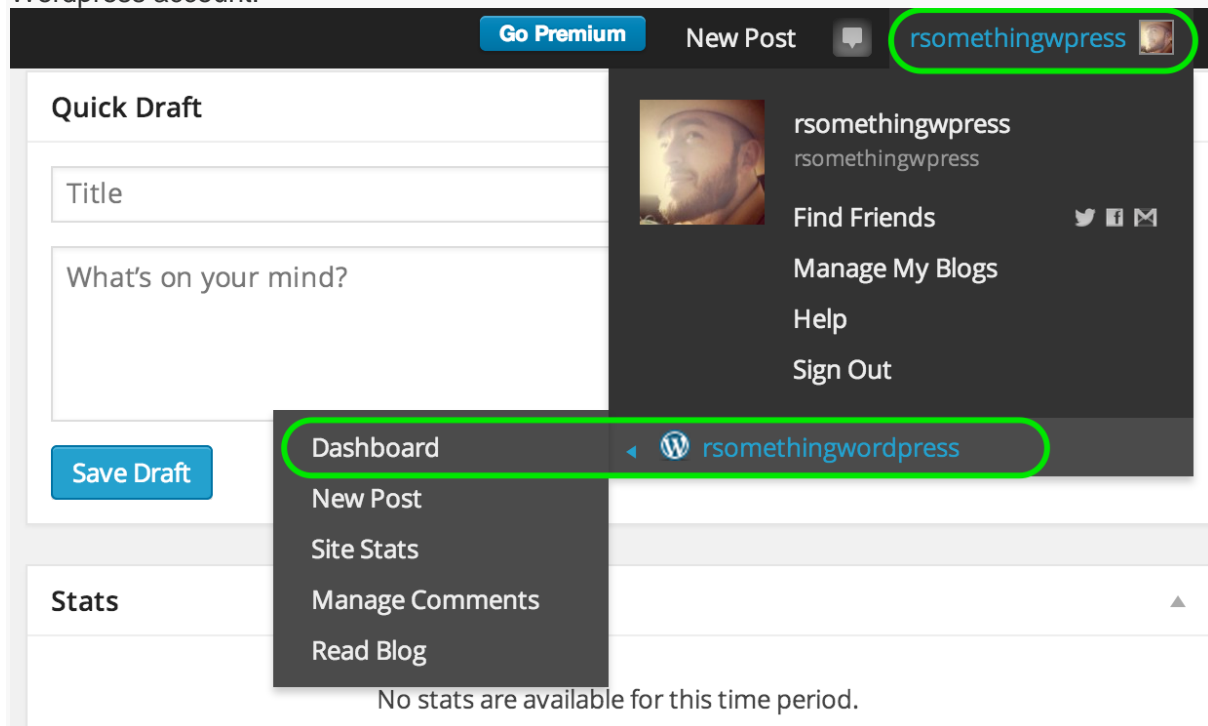
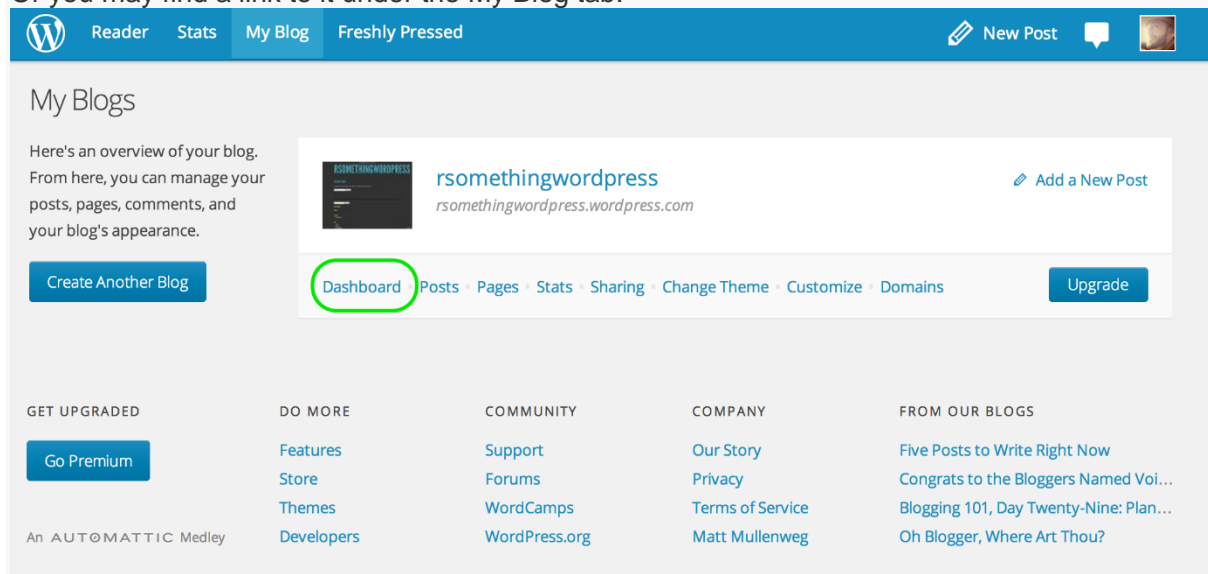

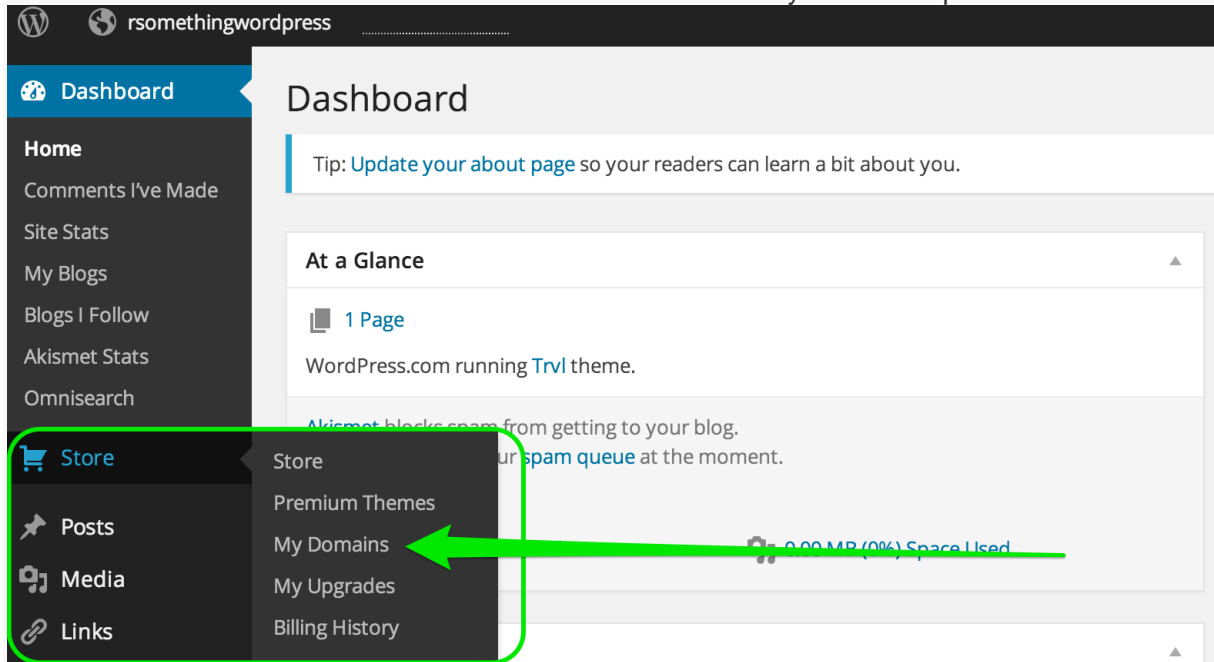


Or you may find a link to it under the My Blog tab:



Regardless of where you find it, if the link you click on says *Dashboard* then you're heading to the right spot.

Now find the Store section of the Dashboard and choose the My Domains option.
